

In this weekend following the Resurrection of the Lord, we see the effects of how others have shared their witness of the events of Holy Week and the Resurrection of Jesus.

Our Gospel today comes from John 20. The chapter begins with the encounter of Mary of Magdala seeing the stone removed from the empty tomb. Shortly after, Jesus appears to Mary and asks why she is weeping. She soon recognizes Jesus and follows his instruction to share her witness, and she later announces to the disciples "I have seen the Lord," bearing witness to what she experienced. Then we come to today's passage, another encounter of the risen Christ, this time Jesus appearing to the disciples through the locked doors.

Thomas, of course known as the one who doubts, needs more proof before he can believe and share his own witness. Jesus invites Thomas to feel the wounds in his side, feel the wounds in his hands, and Thomas' unbelief subsides into a statement of undeniable belief: "My Lord and my God," and now he is added to the list of those who can witness to the resurrection of Christ.

As disciples of Christ, as ones who have recently witnessed the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper, the crucifixion of the Lord as he died to offer us redemption, and his triumphant resurrection from the dead, we are constantly called to bear that witness to all we meet. Bearing witness to the resurrection requires us to open the doors of our hearts and allow the light of Christ to infiltrate our lives. It means embracing the reality of His victory over sin and death and allowing this truth to permeate every aspect of our being. It means living with a profound sense of hope, even in the midst of trials and tribulations, knowing that Christ has conquered all.

> In parishes throughout the world, we have people this members of the Catholic Church are indeed some of the Spirit in their own lives. What better way to witness to the love of Jesus than to learn about him through Scripture and the teachings of the Church over these past months and finally encounter Him in these powerful sacraments? We know converts to the faith are some of the most powerful witnesses in our parish communities.

> Our second reading teaches us how to be a witness to Christ. To love God means to keep his commandments, commandments that we know are not burdensome; rather, they lead us to love God and love our neighbor. Simply living the commandments is a powerful witness in itself. So many times people ask "what can I do to bring my family members back to the faith" or "what can I say that will make someone come to church?" Well, maybe it's not so much about what we do or say, although our actions and words are very important; maybe it's about how we live. Our way of life, whether public or private, is an indication of how we bear witness to God's loving commandments at work in our own lives.

> We are at the beginning of this Easter season, may we be emboldened by the example of the disciples and their unwavering faith in the resurrection. Without their witness to the faith and courage to evangelize, our own lives may have looked very different. May we open our hearts to encounter the risen Christ in our midst and allow His transformative love to work within us. And may we, in turn, bear witness to His resurrection to all we encounter with courage, conviction, and joy, so that all may come to know the true power and glory of our risen Lord Jesus Christ.



Written in the Wounds

For all the condemnation Thomas the Doubter has received in 2000 years of homilies, I think there's something to admire in him.

Thomas is not unique. We all waver at some point, overcome by hesitation, distracted by the clamor of the world which seeks at every turn to shout above the whisper of the divine.

Thomas knows what he saw on Good Friday: his friend nailed to a cross, a sword driven through his body. He saw the blood and the water. He saw these things with his own eyes, eyes given to him by God, eyes which have never failed him before. And God doesn't ask us to suspend reality to believe in Him. He only asks us to be discerning about how that reality is interpreted in our hearts.

Thomas knows the man before him is either a fraud, preying on the hopes and anxieties of the traumatized disciples, or he is the Christ, the Savior of the world, accomplisher of impossible things. But where to look, to tell the difference?

Satan once appeared to the great mystic saint, Teresa of Avila, disguised as Jesus. She knew instantly that he was a fraud. Enraged, he demanded to know where his deception had failed. "You have no wounds," she told him simply.

Could we have accepted a savior who did not bleed? I don't think we could, because sooner or later, we would all stand before him and say, "Here is where the world hurt me. Here, and here, and here. What about you?" Christ can point to his hands, his feet, his side. "Here, and here, and here," he can say. "And I overcame them all."

It's the wounds, you see. The truth is in the wounds.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

After a civil divorce, is a Catholic obligated to pursue an annulment?

Answer:

Many Catholics are not exactly sure what an annulment does. An annulment does not deny that a marriage took place, nor does it deny that there once was love. It does not mean that people say anything untrue, such as they never loved each other or that everything in their marriage was wrong. An annulment does not negate children, nor make them illegitimate. An annulment addresses the spiritual aspect of marriage. In effect, an annulment says that at the time of the wedding, there was either something present or something absent that prevented the sacrament from taking place. It is a spiritual determination that, if granted in the affirmative, allows a person to marry in the Church.

Annulments have no legal standing and are unable to be used in a civil court. Therefore, a Catholic has no moral obligation to pursue an annulment. However, when the tragedy of divorce occurs, and there is no hope for reconciliation, annulments may help bring some spiritual closure to a person's life. Some people have found the process to be healing and others have found it to be difficult. Speak to your priest or a member of the Diocesan Tribunal staff to decide what is best for you.

REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO THE BAPTISM OF YOUR CHILD

In order to baptize your child in our parish, parent (s) please come to the Parish Office to obtain an outline, describing the necessary requirements — PRIOR to both the parents and godparents being scheduled to att a required pre-baptism class:

Parents

- 1. Must be registered parishioner in our parish
- 2. Parent (s) must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation certificate.
 - 3. If the parents are married, provide a copy of their Catholic marriage
 - 4. Parent(s) must provide a copy of their child's birth certificate.

Godparent (s) At Least One:

- 1. Must be a practicing Catholic, following the teachings of the Catholic faith.
- 2. The godparent must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation (certificate is required).
 - 3. The godparent, if married must provide a copy of their Catholic marriage certificate.

Only after receiving the required documentation, must the parent(s) and godparents (s) have attended the pre-baptism class, can the baptism of your child be scheduled.



After the formation period, he will discern if he would like to make his promise to become a Missionary Servant of the Word for one year, serving in whatever mission he is sent to here in the United


