In today's Gospel Jesus tells us that the Kingdom of God will be given to those who live the Lord's way of truth and sacred love. St. Francis de Sales expands on this:

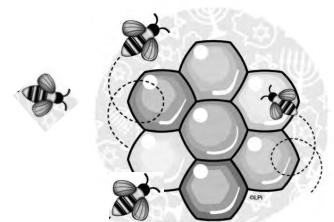
How happy we shall be if we love this divine Goodness that has prepared such favors and blessings for us! God became one of us so that we might become like God. Our Savior gave us His life not only to heal the sick, work miracles, and teach us what we must do to have a life-giving, healthy life. He also used his entire life choosing to shape His cross by enduring insults from those for whom He was doing so much good. He chose to give up His life for His people who rejected Him. 

To live in our world, and live contrary to the cultural values that stress material things, selfish ambition and power is to go against the current of the river of this life. Yet, we can let go of these disordered passions by practicing interior gentleness, simplicity, humility, and above all, sacred love. To let go of all that is not of God in us is to strive to live an authentic human life of truth and holy love.



As no human can live this way without God's help, such a life is a continual going out of ourselves to embrace God's goodness for us. The person who chooses God's divine love lives beyond his or her selfish desires: They no longer live for themselves, but in and for their Savior.

Bees are first larvae but forsake this stage to become flying bees. We do the same. If we live a graced life, we live a new loftier human life than the life we lived before we accepted God's love. Our new life is in God with Jesus Christ who gives it. This new life of heavenly love vivifies and animates our soul. With God's help then, we are capable of using our life to walk in the way of this divine love. As God's most dear children, we are able to generously produce the fruit of truth and holy love found in God's Kingdom.

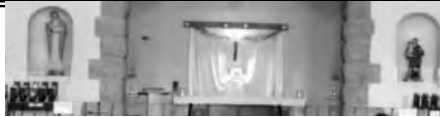

## COME TO ADORATION

**The best time you will spend on earth!**

If we could see just a fraction of the graces available before the Blessed Sacrament, we would flock to the nearest chapel each and every day. When I visited churches to deliver a speech, I could often sense when that church had Adoration. I could sense it because there was a feeling of peace and unusually high Mass attendance.

The Blessed Sacrament draws people. It imbues the church with an aura of holiness. It also draws vocations. A young man want to feel the Holy Spirit—and if he doesn't he is not going to aim for a life that is priestly. Period. It is time to bring back the Holy Spirit.

The best way to do that is through exercising the gifts Christ gave us—reading Scripture, reciting the Rosary, and Adoration.

Adoration gives the parish an active chrism. It is dynamic. It becomes the very heart of a vibrant parish. It imbues a radiance. When are we going to realize this and save our Church, in these crisis times? We need Adoration everywhere. Adoration keeps evil away and invites God's luminosity, which dispels darkness.

St. Margaret Mary saw the host in this fashion. Often while praying before the Blessed Sacrament, it came alive to her. It serves as a window—a port hole — into the heavenly dimension. It drew her like a magnet. "I could have spend whole days and nights there, without eating or drinking, and without knowing what I as doing except that I was being consumed in His presence like a burning taper, in order to return Him love for love," said this saint. It was there that St. Margaret Mary found a sense of safety.

## REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO THE BAPTISM OF YOUR CHILD

In order to baptize your child in our parish, the following documents are required before you begin the process.

1. Must be registered parishioner
2. Must have child's birth certificate
3. Godparents must be a practicing Catholic, in good standing. This means they have received Confirmation (certificate is required). If they are married, a copy of their Catholic marriage is required. A letter of good standing and proof of completion of a baptismal preparation is required for both parents and Godparents These forms will be included in packet.



Preparation takes time. Please contact Donna Wicker at (760) 900-2336 to receive all necessary forms and information.

I can not set a date for baptism unless all requirements are met.

If you are pregnant, discerning to baptize your child or anticipating being a godparent within a year please take note of the Baptismal classes for the remainder of the year.
