

Reflection for Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe; Year B

St. Joseph Catholic Church– Marion, IA

First Reading: *Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17*

Commentary:

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King as the culmination of the Church's liturgical year before we begin a new liturgical year with Advent. There are two themes resonating through the readings for this great feast: 1.) the end of time and the final judgment; and 2.) the reign of Jesus Christ as king of the universe. In the first reading, we see God portrayed as a shepherd with the people who faithfully follow Him being His sheep. God gathers together His scattered "sheep" and tends to His people. As His sheep, we are called to follow Him, listening to His voice and doing what He tells us. Like a good shepherd, God will protect us and care for our every need. With Him, we have security. Still, we can stray from the fold. If we do, God will judge us accordingly. God will separate the "sheep" from the "goats" (that is, those who listen to him and follow him and those who don't). And there are consequences for not following God as our shepherd, as we will see in the Gospel reading.

Second Reading: *1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28*

Commentary:

In this passage, the Apostle Paul speaks of the centrality of the resurrection of Jesus to our faith and reminds us of our future resurrection at the end of time. Jesus Christ is the "firstfruits" of those who have died being raised from the dead, meaning that he paves the way for the resurrection of His followers. With His resurrection He conquered death and made possible for all of us who are dead in sin to be brought to new life. Jesus' resurrection comes with a promise: those who belong to Him will experience resurrection too. That is, Christians who faithfully follow Jesus have the hope of the final resurrection of our bodies when we will be united with God in heaven for all of eternity.



In fact, we proclaim our belief in this every time we recite the creed ("I look forward to the resurrection of the dead"). This resurrection will come at the end of time when Jesus will come again. Then, His reign as king will be brought to perfection, when death and the evil one are defeated and "everything is subjected to him."

Gospel Reading:

Matthew 25:31-46

Commentary:

In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks of the end of time and the final judgment. He refers to Himself as the Son of Man and speaks of His kingship. The judgment is illustrated by the separation of sheep and goats (piggybacking on the first reading's shepherding example). The sheep represent the righteous who love and serve the king, Jesus. They do this by loving and serving those in need. Here, then, Jesus shows how love of God is inseparable from love of neighbor, for He explains, "whatever you did for one of the least brother of mine, you did for me." Thus, we love and serve Jesus through loving and serving the needy. On the other hand, the goats represent those who ignore Jesus, turning a blind eye to those in need and, therefore, not loving and serving Jesus, the king. At the final judgment, the sheep will be separated from the goats. The former will be rewarded with eternal life and the latter will be punished with eternal damnation. The way we choose to live determines which group we will be in.

Taking it Home:

Take time to reflect this week on how you can better live in a way that honors Jesus as the king of your life. Think about this question, in particular: Am I living more like a sheep or a goat (according to the Gospel)? And, how will my actions affect my eternal destiny?

Eucharistic Adoration & Exposition Explained

Question	Adoration	Exposition
<i>What is it?</i>	Adoration is any time spent in prayer before Jesus Christ truly present in the Eucharist. The Blessed Sacrament needs not be exposed to view.	Exposition is the ritual, liturgical act of public worship during which Jesus, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, is displayed for viewing and veneration in a monstrance or ciborium. It further extends the worship given to God at Mass.
<i>What is it for?</i>	Private Devotion, strengthening one's personal connection to Jesus in the Eucharist.	Public Worship, extending the worship given to God in the Mass throughout the day.
<i>Who is it for?</i>	Adoration is for any of the faithful who desire to honor the real presence of the Lord in the Eucharist by spending time in private devotion where the Blessed Sacrament is reposed. This time can be spent alone or with others and is typically a very fruitful spiritual practice.	Exposition is for the whole Christian community and the world. It publicly declares our belief in the presence of God in the Eucharist. It should thus happen when a number of the faithful are able to gather and is to be led by a member of the clergy, or in their absence a delegated lay person.
<i>When does it happen?</i>	Anytime a member of the faithful visits a place of repose for the Blessed Sacrament.	Exposition occurs at fixed hours when two or more members of the faithful will be present. In chapels with extended exposition Jesus should only be exposed and reposed a maximum of 2 times daily; typically once before and once after the Mass.

**REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO
THE BAPTISM OF YOUR CHILD**

In order to baptize your child in our parish, the following documents are required before you begin the process.

1. Must be registered parishioner
2. Must have child's birth certificate
3. Godparents must be a practicing Catholic, in good standing. This means they have received Confirmation (certificate is required). If they are married, a copy of their Catholic marriage is required. A letter of good standing and proof of completion of a baptismal preparation is required for both parents and Godparents These forms will be included in packet.
