## Reflection for Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time: Year C

### An Increase of Faith

After hearing Jesus teach about what the future inevitability will bring and the need to offer unconditional forgiveness regardless of circumstances, the apostles ask him to increase their faith. They may have had difficulty understanding the rationale behind his teachings or found them lacking practical sense. What they are hearing is something new. After all, people had settled into what were considered acceptable protocols for dealing with sinners, prostitutes, adulterers, those who hurt you, the poor, the physically challenged, adversaries, and law breakers. Now they are presented with a teaching that turns all of this upside down and conveys God's nonviolent vision of how human nature and the world are intended to operate. It is very possible that these early hearers of the Word found themselves ill equipped to do as Jesus taught. While truth resonated through Jesus's words and actions, they were asking to have what Jesus had so that they could more adequately do it. They knew they needed more.

God's presence and His vision are not immediately visible to the naked eye. Faith becomes the lens a person needs to see, with Divine light, beyond the limits of human sight. This "faith-seeing" gives everything its proper sacred character. St. Augustine tells us that, "faith is to believe what you do not see; the reward of this faith is to see what you believe." Jesus saw his way through moral dilemmas, conflicts, questions, and challenges differently than other leaders of the day. He acted in ways that were not the norm and often against Sabbath law. The apostles knew this. They also realized that he had a conviction to Truth that they admired. These close friends of Jesus knew that they were new travelers on this road of discipleship and needed all the help they could get to stay their course and remain committed to the journey. We are not much different.

The apostles wanted faith. Faith not to despair at the inevitable suffering and evil that are a part of life. Faith to patiently wait knowing that God's vision still has its time and will not disappoint. Faith to forgive unconditionally even when hurt in the harshest way. Faith to love, especially those who are most difficult to love and those who have wronged us. Faith to welcome the sinner, comfort those who are afflicted, break a Sabbath rule when a situation calls for mercy and compassion, and to work for justice and find nonviolent solutions to conflicts. Faith to step aside so that someone else can be first. Faith to know that God is love and that how we treat one another reflects our love for God. Faith to know that it is God's kingdom that must be built and not our own and faith to know that it is only in dying that we find eternal life.



The world today is not much different than it was in Jesus' day. We still have great measures of inequity, injustice, corruption, violence, excessive power and privilege, entitlement, selfishness, greed, the exploitation of human beings, disregard for human life, and the persecution of those who challenge popular

political and societal principles. As present-day disciples of Jesus Christ our feet are in two worlds. While we know what Jesus says is true, we are also mired in a world that can easily pull us in other directions. It is easy to give into popular and contemporary philosophies or trends, knowing that we are really compromising our Gospel principles. It is hard to do what is just and right. It is difficult to trust. We need faith.

Our world is experiencing a crisis of faith, the loss of meaning and an absence of hope. There is so much confusion about what truth is, what it means to be a human being and what happiness is really all about. Corruption, greed, and violence are on the increase and conflict of one kind, or another are all too commonplace. Even believers find themselves a bit "weak kneed" when confronted with a defense of their faith and the ramifications for doing so. We are afraid to speak up and afraid to offend. Yet, the Gospel is the Gospel and we either believe it wholeheartedly or we do not. The first disciples were in exactly this same place. They knew what they needed to succeed.

Friends of Jesus, no matter in what time or place, have a lot in common. We have heard the same teachings and often find ourselves in exactly the same place as those who have come before us. Our nation, world, and Church are all in crisis. We need to tone down the voice of violence and start speaking gentle words of peace. We need to stop using words suggestive of battle, defense, and war and bring ourselves back to the quiet place where the words of the Beatitudes were first spoken. Those words, as well as the perfect prayer given to us by Jesus, are what call us back to truth. And, if we ever feel ill-equipped to do as Jesus asks (which may be more often than we think!), may we have the humility and courage to ask him, "Lord, increase my faith." Then, if we are truly in love with God, we will do what needs to be done and say what needs to be said without a desire for acknowledgement or praise or concern about the consequences. We are only doing what we are asked to do. — Fr. Mark Suslenko

REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO THE BAPTISM OF YOUR CHILD

In order to baptize your child in our parish, the following documents are required before you begin the process.

- 1. Must be registered parishioner
2. Must have child's birth certificate
3. Godparents must be a practicing Catholic, in good standing. This means they have received Confirmation (certificate is required). If they are married, a copy of their Catholic marriage is required. A letter of good standing and proof of completion of a baptismal preparation is required for both parents and Godparents. These forms will be included in packet.





## LIVE THE LITURGY

### Inspiration for the week

Why does God allow evil and suffering to occur? Looking around at what is happening in the world, it is tempting to get angry with God for not actively intervening. Jesus walked among the suffering and evil of his day. While he healed some things, he simply sat with the sinner, challenged the leaders, and spoke against injustice. Jesus spoke of God's kingdom and his vision for humanity. But he made it very clear that it is our responsibility to realize this vision. The disciples saw how Jesus lived and dealt with the day's circumstances. They wanted that same faith and determination. They wanted his fortitude and courage. Mostly, they wanted Jesus' confidence and patience that God's vision would someday be fulfilled. In the meantime, waiting in joyful hope, we become servants who do what is necessary: love, repent of our sin, show mercy, be compassionate and fight injustice. Willingly giving witness to our faith, we expect nothing in return.



## SAINT OF THE WEEK

Bruno, born in 1030, is also known as Saint Bruno the Carthusian for the monastic order he founded. He studied in Reims and was ordained in Cologne in 1055. In 1057 he went back to Reims to lead the school, a post he kept for almost 20 years. He was made chancellor of the church of Reims in 1075 but left soon after in protest of the behavior of new bishop Manasses de Gournai who was finally deposed in 1080. Bruno refused the nomination to replace de Gournai as it was his intention to retire to live in solitude and prayer. He had a vision in a dream to go with Bishop (later Saint) Hugh of Grenoble. Bruno, Hugh, and five other religious settled at Chartreuse and founded the Carthusian order in 1084.

This first period of monastic life was not to last long. Bruno was called to help Urban II, a former student of his, against the antipope Guibert of Ravenna and the hostile Holy Roman Emperor Henry IV. While working with Urban II, he rejected another offer to become bishop, this time of Calabria. Eventually Bruno was allowed to return to monastic life. Count Roger of Sicily and Calabria befriended Bruno and the monks of his order, granting them the land where they founded St. Mary's at La Torre. The order was known for its strict asceticism, poverty, and prayer and its unique organization combining the life of the hermit with that of the collective life of traditional monks.

Saint Bruno wrote several commentaries on the psalms and on St. Paul's epistles. He died on October 6, 1101, and was never formally canonized because his order renounces all public honors. However, Pope Leo X gave permission for Carthusians to celebrate his feast in 1514 and his name was added to the Roman calendar in 1623.

## The 12 Promises of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary

Faithful Catholics consecrate to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, in a spirit of reparation, the First Friday of each month. Jesus himself made the following promises to St. Margaret Mary in favor of those who practice and promote this devotion.

1. I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
2. I will establish peace in their families and will unite families that are divided.
3. I will comfort them in all their afflictions
4. I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all in death
5. I will bestow the blessings of Heaven on all their enterprises
6. Sinners shall find in My Heart the source and the infinite ocean of mercy
7. Tepid souls shall become fervent
8. Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection
9. I will bless every place in which an Image of my Heart shall be exposed and honored and will imprint My love on the hearts of those who would wear this image on their person. I will also destroy in them all disordered movements.
10. I will give the priests who are animated by a tender devotion to my Divine Heart the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
11. Those who promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart, never to be effaced
12. I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who communicate on the First Friday in nine consecutive months the grace of final penitence; they shall not die in my disgrace nor without receiving their Sacraments. My divine Heart shall be the safe refuge in this last moment.



### Celebrating of the Feast of the Sacred Heart

The devotions attached to these promises are:

- Receiving Communion frequently
- First Fridays: going to Confession and receiving the Eucharist on the first Friday of each month for nine consecutive months.

Many parishes will offer public First Friday devotions; if they do, you must perform First Fridays publicly. If it isn't so offered in your parish, you can do this privately, going to Confession, receiving the Eucharist, and offering your prayers for the intention of the Holy Father.

- Holy Hour: Eucharistic Adoration for one hour on Thursdays ("Could you not watch one hour with me?"). Holy Hour can be made alone or as part of a group with formal prayers.


