

On the first Sunday after Pentecost of each liturgical year, the While Augustine's faith was not undone by his inability to the Athanasian Creed tells us.

Though the Church dedicates every Sunday, and indeed, every second of every day to the Most Holy Trinity, it is fitting that we commemorate this mystery on this, the first Sunday after Pentecost because it was with the descent of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost that the mystery of mysteries was fully revealed (CCC 732).

Now, this is not to say that God did not reveal himself before this. In fact, from the very beginning of creation God, "who dwells in unapproachable light" (1 Tim 6:16) has stooped down to human beings to communicate His very life to them, choosing them as "His heritage" (Psalm 33:12): guarding sending of the only-begotten Son of God, the Word made flesh, Jesus Christ, and through Him, the Holy Spirit, that the before Jesus one could have said that the one true God loves, but no one possessed the knowledge to declare with the beloved disciple: "God is love" (1 Jn 4:8). "That God Himself is an eternal exchange of love, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and He has destined us to share in that exchange" (CCC 221). Yes, God has revealed Himself fully to us by sending His Son and the Spirit of Love, yet even now we cannot fully comprehend this mystery. For the mystery of the Holy Trinity supernatural truth that is hidden in God, which can never be still only partially comprehensible through faith.

The truth of this is beautifully illustrated in a story about St. Augustine. Legend has it that while St. Augustine was working on his treatise *De Trinitate* (On the Trinity), he was walking along the seashore, meditating on how the one God Himself. could possibly be three Persons, when he happened upon a child who was attempting to pour all the water of the sea into a tiny hole he had dug in the sand. In reply to the child's strange pursuit Augustine said, "That is impossible. Obviously, the sea is too large and the hole too small." To which the child replied, "Indeed, but I will sooner draw all the

We who have been immersed in the unfathomable depths of the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity and baptized "in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" may ponder the above description and say, "That is not us. We have taken the plunge. We have leapt where reason could not them; protecting them; saving them; forgiving them. go." To this I ask: Have we truly? Precious Things

I once wrote an article about a school that embraced the Reggio Emilia approach to education. This meant, in practice, a lot of fascinating things, and it was a fun piece to work on. But all these years later, I could not accurately describe the Reggio Emilia style of learning to anyone except to say this: they give the kids glass bowls and china plates.

That's what stuck with me, and that's what sticks out in my memory amidst the hundreds of intervening articles and interviews on other equally fascinating topics. I remember those glass bowls and cups lining the shelves, the fine china dishes, the beautiful shiny cutlery the children used for lunch.

This was a pre-school, and these students were three-year-olds. "If they drop a cup and it shatters, then they learn that glass can break. We clean it up," the teacher said with a shrug. The idea was that a child will never learn to handle a fragile, precious thing — and grow into an adult who can respect and cherish a fragile, precious thing — if they are not sincerely trusted with a precious thing whose fragility they bear personal witness to.

The breaking, you see, was part of the education.

The disciples worshiped, but they doubted. And yet, Christ gave them the Great Commission anyway, something fragile and important, something that could be easily dropped and easily broken. Christ knew who they were, what they were. They were mere human beings, deeply imperfect, scared and hesitant, a little slow on the uptake. He knows that's exactly what we are, too. But he gives us the Great Commission just as he gave it to them. Because that is what the Faith is: it is something perfectly beautiful, passed from one flawed person to another, throughout the ages — constantly dropped, constantly broken, and constantly, miraculously, pieced back together again.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

At a parish council meeting, our pastor mentioned the need for deacons. It is something I am considering. How do I know if I have a vocation? What steps should I take next?

Answer:

Any and all gifts that the Holy Spirit gives to the church are for the good of the community. As members of the Body of Christ, what one member does affects all. What the body does also affects each member. A vocation or call to ministry is tested and verified by the church. Through prayer, instruction, and service, a vocation is tested, and then acknowledged by the official call to orders or to service.

If you are considering becoming a deacon, the first step would be to talk to your pastor. He will be able to give you more specific information on the program in your diocese, what is expected of you, and how you apply. You might also begin to see a spiritual director, someone who can help you with your faith journey and vocation discernment. They do so by focusing on prayer. your relationship with God, and spiritual practices. Finally, you'll need to see the diocesan vocation director in charge of deacons to apply. Best wishes!

REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO THE BAPTISM OF YOUR CHILD

In order to baptize your child in our parish, parent (s) please come to the Parish Office to obtain an outline, describing the necessary requirements — PRIOR to both the parents and godparents being scheduled to att a required pre-baptism class:

Parents

- 1. Must be registered parishioner in our parish
- 2. Parent (s) must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation certificate.
 - 3. If the parents are married, provide a copy of their Catholic marriage
 - 4. Parent(s) must provide a copy of their child's birth certificate.

Godparent (s) At Least One:

- 1. Must be a practicing Catholic, following the teachings of the Catholic faith.
- 2. The godparent must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation (certificate is required).
 - 3. The godparent, if married must provide a copy of their Catholic marriage certificate.

Only after receiving the required documentation, must the parent(s) and godparents (s) have attended the pre-baptism class, can the baptism of your child be scheduled.




