Reflection for The Most Holy Trinity: Year B
The Most Holy Trinity – May 26, 2024
Fr. Stephen Yusko

Readings: Deuteronomy 4:32–34, 39–40 • Ps 33:4–5, 6, 9, 18–19, 20, 22 • Rom 8:14–17 • Mt 28:16–20 bible.usccb.org/bible/readings/052624.cfm

On the first Sunday after Pentecost of each liturgical year, the Church bids us celebrate in a special manner “the central mystery of the Christian faith and life,” the mystery from which “all the other mysteries of the faith flow” (CCC 234). The mystery in whose name we sign ourselves with the sign of the cross and receive the Sacrament of Baptism. The mystery of God in Himself. That is, the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity. The mystery that God is one in three and three in one. One in essence and three in persons — Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. “One God in Trinity, and Trinity in Unity” as the Athanasian Creed tells us.

Though the Church dedicates every Sunday, and indeed, every second of every day to the Most Holy Trinity, it is fitting that we commemorate this mystery on this, the first Sunday after Pentecost because it was with the descent of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost that the mystery of mysteries was fully revealed (CCC 732).

Now, this is not to say that God did not reveal himself before this. In fact, from the very beginning of creation God, “who dwells in unapproachable light” (1 Tim 6:16) has stooped down to human beings to communicate His very life to them, choosing them as “His heritage” (Psalm 33:12): guarding them; protecting them; saving them; forgiving them. Gradually revealing himself to them by speaking “in many and various ways” (Heb 1:1–2). Yet, it was only with the sending of the only-begotten Son of God, the Word made flesh, Jesus Christ, and through Him, the Holy Spirit, that the hidden life of God was shown forth in all of its splendor. For before Jesus one could have said that the one true God loves, but no one possessed the knowledge to declare with the beloved disciple: “God is love” (1 Jn 4:8). “That God Himself is an eternal exchange of love, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and He has destined us to share in that exchange” (CCC 221). Yes, God has revealed Himself fully to us by sending His Son and the Spirit of Love, yet even now we cannot fully comprehend this mystery. For the mystery of the Holy Trinity is a mystery in the strict sense of the word; that is, it is a supernatural truth that is hidden in God, which can never be known unless it is revealed by God, and even when revealed is still only partially comprehensible through faith.

The truth of this is beautifully illustrated in a story about St. Augustine. Legend has it that while St. Augustine was working on his treatise *De Trinitate* (On the Trinity), he was walking along the seashore, meditating on how the one God could possibly be three Persons, when he happened upon a child who was attempting to pour all the water of the sea into a tiny hole he had dug in the sand. In reply to the child’s strange pursuit Augustine said, “That is impossible. Obviously, the sea is too large and the hole too small.” To which the child replied, “Indeed, but I will sooner draw all the

water from the sea and empty it into this hole than you will succeed in penetrating the mystery of the Holy Trinity with your limited understanding.”

While Augustine’s faith was not undone by his inability to comprehend the incomprehensible mystery of the Holy Trinity, there are many whose faith is. Unlike Augustine, they do not believe in order to understand, but they seek to understand in order to believe. And so, the limit of their minds strangles the love in their hearts. It is as if they say, “I do not understand you, so I cannot love you.” Unable to fit the sea into their tiny hole, they conclude that there is no sea, so they settle for what is in the hole. In so doing, they exchange the one true Triune God for an idol, a work of human hands that can be grasped by the mind. In the fear induced by the obscurity of the brilliance of the mystery of the Trinity, then, they shrink back and protest to the Spirit of God that seeks to lead them into the exchange of divine love. They refuse to be defined by their relation to God, as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are defined by their relation to one another. They reject the invitation to plunge into the depths of the mystery of love, and thus, refuse to become children of God (Rom 8:14–17).

We who have been immersed in the unfathomable depths of the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity and baptized “in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit” may ponder the above description and say, “That is not us. We have taken the plunge. We have leapt where reason could not go.” To this I ask: Have we truly? Yes, we may have intellectually assented to the truth that there is one God in three persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We believe that God is love. But have we handed God our hearts as well as our minds? Do we say we believe in God, but live contrary to Him? Do we honor Him with our lips, but find that our hearts are far from Him (Mt 15:8)? God wills to communicate His own divine life to us, and He truly does so when we are baptized in His Name, but this communication demands that we observe all that Jesus has commanded us (Mt 28:16–20). In other words, it demands nothing less than the free gift of our entire selves — body and soul; intellect and will. Love demands love.

This Trinity Sunday, then, do not settle for the idols that you have made with your own hearts and minds; rather, allow yourself to be taken up into the mystery of the exchange of Divine love. For, having freely given yourself to the “love that moves the sun and other stars” (Dante, *Paradiso*), you too will be moved to go out and invite all who believe to enter into this life of love. The life of the Most Holy Trinity — Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The life of God Himself.

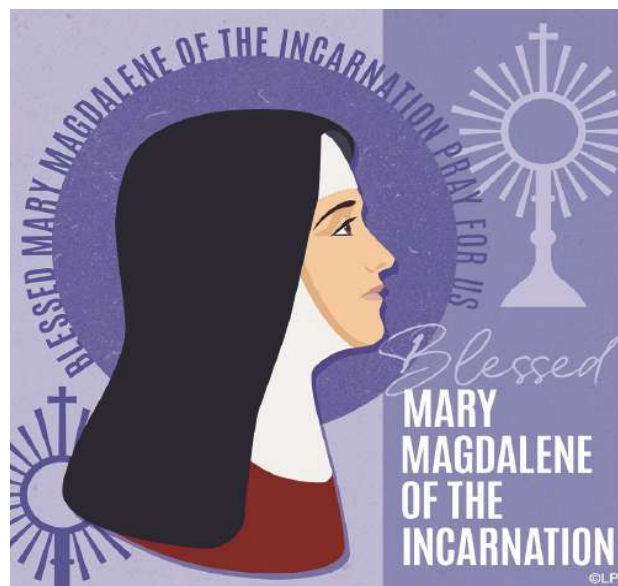

(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC

Precious Things

I once wrote an article about a school that embraced the Reggio Emilia approach to education. This meant, in practice, a lot of fascinating things, and it was a fun piece to work on. But all these years later, I could not accurately describe the Reggio Emilia style of learning to anyone except to say this: they give the kids glass bowls and china plates.

That's what stuck with me, and that's what sticks out in my memory amidst the hundreds of intervening articles and interviews on other equally fascinating topics. I remember those glass bowls and cups lining the shelves, the fine china dishes, the beautiful shiny cutlery the children used for lunch.

This was a pre-school, and these students were three-year-olds. "If they drop a cup and it shatters, then they learn that glass can break. We clean it up," the teacher said with a shrug. The idea was that a child will never learn to handle a fragile, precious thing — and grow into an adult who can respect and cherish a fragile, precious thing — if they are not sincerely trusted with a precious thing whose fragility they bear personal witness to.

The breaking, you see, was part of the education.

The disciples worshiped, but they doubted. And yet, Christ gave them the Great Commission anyway, something fragile and important, something that could be easily dropped and easily broken. Christ knew who they were, what they were. They were mere human beings, deeply imperfect, scared and hesitant, a little slow on the uptake. He knows that's exactly what we are, too. But he gives us the Great Commission just as he gave it to them. Because that is what the Faith is: it is something perfectly beautiful, passed from one flawed person to another, throughout the ages — constantly dropped, constantly broken, and constantly, miraculously, pieced back together again.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

At a parish council meeting, our pastor mentioned the need for deacons. It is something I am considering. How do I know if I have a vocation? What steps should I take next?

Answer:

Any and all gifts that the Holy Spirit gives to the church are for the good of the community. As members of the Body of Christ, what one member does affects all. What the body does also affects each member. A vocation or call to ministry is tested and verified by the church. Through prayer, instruction, and service, a vocation is tested, and then acknowledged by the official call to orders or to service.

If you are considering becoming a deacon, the first step would be to talk to your pastor. He will be able to give you more specific information on the program in your diocese, what is expected of you, and how you apply. You might also begin to see a spiritual director, someone who can help you with your faith journey and vocation discernment. They do so by focusing on prayer, your relationship with God, and spiritual practices. Finally, you'll need to see the diocesan vocation director in charge of deacons to apply. Best wishes!

REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO THE BAPTISM OF YOUR CHILD

In order to baptize your child in our parish, parent (s) please come to the Parish Office to obtain an outline, describing the necessary requirements — PRIOR to both the parents and godparents being scheduled to attend a required pre-baptism class:



Parents

1. Must be registered parishioner in our parish
2. Parent (s) must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation certificate.
3. If the parents are married, provide a copy of their Catholic marriage
4. Parent(s) must provide a copy of their child's birth certificate.

Godparent (s) At Least One:

1. Must be a practicing Catholic, following the teachings of the Catholic faith.
2. The godparent must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation (certificate is required).
3. The godparent, if married must provide a copy of their Catholic marriage certificate.

Only after receiving the required documentation, must the parent(s) and godparents (s) have attended the pre-baptism class, can the baptism of your child be scheduled.

If you have any questions regarding the above, please call the Parish Center Office (928) 377-3435.

Catholic Charities Therapeutic Foster Care is different than traditional foster care because it involves clinical intervention and placement of youth in specially trained foster homes. Children in therapeutic foster care must be medically approved for placement and tend to require more assistance with mental, emotional, and behavioral health needs.
