

Reflection for Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Year B Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time – June 23, 2024 Fr. Madison Hayes



Today, our reflections turn to the profound wisdom contained in the book of Job, a literary masterpiece that stands unique within the sacred canon of Scripture. Job's narrative takes a dramatic approach to the fundamental questions of our existence, unraveling the mysteries of the relationship between God and humanity, good and evil, reward and punishment.

G.K. Chesterton, an expert in the literary arts, aptly described the book of Job as a "riddle." Through its pages, Job invites us to explore the deep recesses of the human heart. Chesterton beautifully captures the essence of Job's quest, stating, "[Job] shakes the pillars of the world and strikes insanely at the heavens; he lashes the stars, but it is not to silence them; it is to make them speak." Job's journey is not a quest to solve a problem but an exploration of the boundless riddle that is God's purpose — a mysterious, misleading, puzzling, and paradoxical encounter with the Infinite.

Unlike a more trivial poet who might have God enter the narrative to provide answers, when God finally speaks, it is to pose questions of His own. God, in his divine wisdom, enters not to solve problems but to reframe them. "Who shut within doors the sea, when it burst forth from the womb?" God reveals that the wonder of the universe lies in its mystery, resisting simple explanations and mechanical solutions. Job's questions about his suffering, though unanswered, invite us to delve into the depths of mystery.

True Wisdom, as depicted in Scripture, is not about finding a direct answer to the problem of



suffering but living in the fear of God, transcending the difficulties faced by Job and entering the transcendent "abyss" of God's Love. The truly wise are those who sail the sea of life, trading on deep waters, recognizing the works of the Lord and His wonders in the abyss.

Job, despite being left with more questions than answers, ultimately found what he was seeking. The good news for us is not a promise to fix all our problems. We are not mere problems to be solved but people to be loved. The love of Christ is the good news, a love so profound that even death cannot pose a problem. The Cross, a violent, beautiful, tragic, and hopeful sight, reveals God's love for us.

As we contemplate the paradox of love and forgiveness offered on the Cross, prefigured in the suffering of Job, we find its strange and high fulfillment in the person of Jesus — the best man with the worst fortune. The book of Job corrects our vision, directing our gaze to the Cross, where the paschal mystery unites us with God. May the love of Christ, the true answer to our deepest longings, impel us to live in awe of His unfathomable love.



The Perfect Storm

I am writing this on a Saturday morning. Saturdays are my writing days, when my husband takes over the kids and the house and I disappear into the office with an enormous cup of coffee and noise-canceling headphones. Saturdays are sacred — if work can be called sacred.

But Saturday morning is also the only time I'm able to consistently get to confession. Every other time the sacrament is offered in my area during the week, I seem to have unavoidable commitments — but on Saturday morning, all I have is work, and how can I let work come before a sacrament, as much as I might secretly want to?

I've spent a good deal of time being bitter about this, because it's just not convenient, having to carve out time from work to run to the other side of town, especially when I get there and there's a line. I sit there in the sanctuary, waiting my turn, checking the clock, stewing, fretting. Obsessing over forgetting one of my sins. Thinking of how much work I have when I get home.

Saturday mornings: a perfect storm, I sometimes call it in my head.

I forge ahead, though. I've never gotten up and dashed back to my desk. I make it into the confessional and I stammer out my pathetic little list and receive absolution. Then I go before the tabernacle to perform my penance.

It's while I am kneeling there that it happens. Always. God awakens, and he cries into the depths of my heart: "Quiet! Be still! Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?"

After teaching all day by the shore of the sea, Jesus asks his disciples to remove him from the crowds. He wants to escape the noise, the clamor, the disquiet. But the clamor follows him, because the world is full of it. Storms crop up wherever we go.

Jesus sleeps through the storm, because he understands what the disciples do not: the storms of the world cannot hurt us. They are only so much noise.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

We are considering homeschooling our children. Does this present a problem when it is time for them to receive the sacraments? What must we do?

Answer:

Homeschooling is legal in all fifty states and like other types of education, has its advantages and its drawbacks. There are many factors to consider, and each family has to decide what the best way to educate its children is. With religious education, many dioceses have a formal policy that outlines procedures and expectations, some of which include more than just academic information. Call the religious education office to find out what they are for your area.

In general, though, an appointment with your parish priest to discuss your situation is the best first step. An opportunity to discuss what is available, what the expectations are for each sacrament, and how you can best prepare your child helps make your time of preparation more effective. The priest can direct you to good catechetical materials, parent information classes, and other choices and possibilities for your child. All parents need to be part of their child's religious education, taking a lead in instilling the values and beliefs of their faith. Communication and information helps us all to teach and preach the Gospel as Jesus did.

REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO THE BAPTISM OF YOUR CHILD

In order to baptize your child in our parish, parent (s) please come to the Parish Office to obtain an outline, describing the necessary requirements — PRIOR to both the parents and godparents being scheduled to att a required pre-baptism class:

Parents

- 1. Must be registered parishioner in our parish
- 2. Parent (s) must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation certificate.
 - 3. If the parents are married, provide a copy of their Catholic marriage
 - 4. Parent(s) must provide a copy of their child's birth certificate.


Godparent (s) At Least One:

- 1. Must be a practicing Catholic, following the teachings of the Catholic faith.
- 2. The godparent must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation (certificate is required).
 - 3. The godparent, if married must provide a copy of their Catholic marriage certificate.

Only after receiving the required documentation, must the parent(s) and godparents (s) have attended the pre-baptism class, can the baptism of your child be scheduled.


