

Reflection for Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Year B Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – June 30, 2024 Fr. Madison Hayes

Readings: Wis 1:13–15; 2:23–24 • Ps 30:2, 4, 5–6, 11, 12, 13 • 2 Cor 8:7, 9, 13–15 • Mk 5:21–43 or 5:21–24, 35b–43 bible.usccb.org/bible/readings/063024.cfm

Today, as we reflect on the intertwining paths of philosophy and faith, we are reminded that wisdom. the pursuit of profound understanding, takes different forms. The Ancient Greeks embarked on an autonomous quest for wisdom, seeking answers fundamental questions about freedom, the soul, and the nature of a person. On the other hand, the Hebrew perspective illuminates that true wisdom is a gift from God, revealed and received, not merely grasped at through human endeavors.

In our modern era, there is a prevalent belief that one can navigate life's profound questions independently, asserting, "I don't need God." Yet, our Scriptures today call us to a different truth. They remind us that our very existence is a gift from God, who "fashioned all things that they might have being." We are created in the image of God, and our immortal souls derive their life from Him. However, this immortal nature doesn't shield us from the experience of death. God, who does not delight in destruction, warns us of the envy of the devil, seeking to pull us into the depths of the netherworld.

The wisdom we gain from Sacred Scripture is not a mere intellectual exercise; it profoundly matters. It matters in distinguishing between the true and the false, but more crucially, it shapes how we live our lives in the present and future. These are the questions that provide ultimate meaning to our existence and guide our choices.

In the Gospel, we encounter Jairus, a wise synagogue official facing an existential threat as his daughter lies at the brink of death. Filled with desperation, he falls at the feet of Jesus, pleading for healing. Despite the challenges, Jesus encourages Jairus, saying, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." This faith, like wisdom, is not self-generated; it is a gift from God, something received rather than achieved.

As we navigate the challenges of our lives, especially in the face of existential threats and the envy of the devil attempting to disrupt our reality, we are challenged to reflect on Jairus's response. How will we choose to act? Will we, like Jairus, turn to Jesus in faith, trusting in the wisdom and faith we have received from God?

Remember, faith and wisdom are not meant to be hoarded but shared. Just as wisdom aids others in finding answers for their present lives, faith offers the promise of eternal life. Therefore, we are called to embrace the wisdom and faith we have received and, in turn, generously share them with those around us. May God's wisdom and the gift of faith guide us on our journey, shaping our choices and bringing meaning to our lives.

The Touch of Christ

For a long time, I didn't understand why the virtual Masses of the pandemic were so wearisome to me. Theoretically, shouldn't it be a tired mother's dream, fulfilling her Sunday obligation from the couch, not having to worry how much noise the kids are making?

But it wasn't. Seeing Mass without experiencing it left me hungry. It left me starving.

Then a wise priest explained it to me. "Watching virtual Mass is like taking a virtual shower," he said.

Grace might not be something we can see with our eyes, but it is very much something that is transmitted physically. Jesus has a human body for a reason. He needs to touch people.

We see that nowhere more clearly than in this Gospel. The crowds are pressing on him, everyone trying to get close, everyone trying to share his space. The hemorrhaging woman claws her way through, desperate to make physical contact with him, any part of him, even his cloak. The synagogue official begs Jesus to come and "lay hands" on his daughter, knowing that this is the only way for her to survive. He doesn't ask for Jesus' good thoughts or approving gaze. He knows that isn't what he needs.

In the Gospels, Jesus saves people chiefly through his own touch because he wants to show us — you and me, sitting in the pews — something very important about how we are saved.

But where do you and I find the touch of Jesus Christ? Where do you and I find salvation?

It's in the water flowing over the infant's forehead. It's in the Host dissolving on our tongues. It's in the oil that is pressed to the skin of the confirmand, the dying man, and the brand-new priest. It's in the embrace of the newly married couple. It's in the extended hand of the priest as he says, "Your sins are forgiven."

It's still here, two thousand years later. It's still waiting for us to reach out and grasp it.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

In today's digital world, do we really need to be face-to-face with a priest to confess our sins? Would Facetime or Zoom ever be allowed?

Answer:

The question of whether or not Catholics can celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation virtually (via social media, by phone, or in some other way) is a question that has actually been around for several years. The recent COVID-19 pandemic brought the question back in a new way, especially as many parishes were forced to introduce a sort of "social distanced" confession, with the sacrament being celebrated outdoors.

In reflecting on this question, however, there are a couple points that we want to keep in mind. First, as the Code of Canon Law observes in different places, the faithful have a right to the sacraments of the Church and the Church's ministers have a responsibility to make them accessible. At the same time, however, we always have to be sure that we respect the nature of the sacraments themselves.

Although modern forms of technology and communication can help us in our work of evangelization catechesis, the Pontifical Council for Social Communication has reminded us that, "Virtual reality is no substitute for the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, the sacramental reality of the other sacraments, and shared worship in a flesh and blood human community. There are no sacraments on the internet" (The Church and the Internet, no. 9).

Although our encounters with others on the internet and via social media can be considered "real" in one sense, in the sacraments we encounter Christ in a personal and ecclesial way. It is never just a private experience but is always grounded in the life of the Church and this means that it must truly be personal, including the contact between the confessor and the penitent. While the convenience or ease of online celebrations might be appealing for many reasons, at heart, we always want to keep in mind the fullness of the Church's tradition and the meaning of the sacraments.

REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO THE BAPTISM OF YOUR CHILD

In order to baptize your child in our parish, parent (s) please come to the Parish Office to obtain an outline, describing the necessary requirements — PRIOR to both the parents and godparents being scheduled to att a required pre-baptism class:

Parents

- 1. Must be registered parishioner in our parish
- 2. Parent (s) must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation certificate.
 - 3. If the parents are married, provide a copy of their Catholic marriage
 - 4. Parent(s) must provide a copy of their child's birth certificate.

Godparent (s) At Least One:

- 1. Must be a practicing Catholic, following the teachings of the Catholic faith.
- 2. The godparent must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation (certificate is required).
 - 3. The godparent, if married must provide a copy of their Catholic marriage certificate.

Only after receiving the required documentation, must the parent(s) and godparents (s) have attended the pre-baptism class, can the baptism of your child be scheduled.


