Reflection for Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Year B  
Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – July 21, 2024

Have you ever felt like a sheep without a shepherd?

Have you ever felt lost or alone in your faith? Abandoned, even? Do you know the feeling of going to Mass, perhaps at an unfamiliar parish — or perhaps not — and bracing yourself for what you might experience? Ever had a particularly bad experience with a priest, or looked at problems in the Church, or our nation, or the world, and wondered, “Why don’t the bishops do or say something?”

Let’s acknowledge the elephant in the room. These feelings are familiar to many of us — perhaps most. Some of us might feel tempted to look back wistfully at some point in the past when we imagine the Church was on stronger footing and think, “This would never have happened back then!” And maybe so, or maybe not. In any case, plenty of other bad things did happen back then. Our experience of lostness and abandonment is nothing new.

It’s there in the first reading from Jeremiah, where we find shepherds actively misleading and scattering the Lord’s flock. In context, this refers particularly to certain late kings of Judah condemned by name in the previous chapter. These kings were sons of David, expected to be leaders spiritually as well as politically and militarily. They are called to be “shepherds that feed my sheep” (Jeremiah 23:2 Douay-Rheims). Instead, Jeremiah says these kings are set on “nothing except their own gain, shedding innocent blood and practicing oppression and extortion” (cf. Jeremiah 22:17).

Today’s Gospel says that Jesus was “moved with pity” by the crowd, “for they were like sheep without a shepherd.” There’s nothing here about bad shepherds— but Jesus has plenty to say about them elsewhere! Just by calling himself “the Good Shepherd,” our Lord implies that there are bad ones: “hirelings” or “hired men” he calls them (cf. John 10:11–14). And from all Jesus has to say about the religious leaders of the day — scribes, Pharisees, and so forth — it’s clear who he’s talking about.

What about in the Church age? I would love to tell you that when God says through Jeremiah, “I will appoint shepherds for them who will shepherd them so that they need no longer fear and tremble, and none shall be missing,” he was talking about the Church’s pastors,

especially the bishops. And, indeed, heroic and saintly bishops and priests from apostolic times to the present have been appointed by God to shepherd his people amid many difficulties. But it’s fair to say that, as far as we can tell, they have never been the norm. Some of you may know a much-quoted line ascribed to St. John Chrysostom: “The road to hell is paved with the skulls of bishops.” The saint didn’t really say that, but here’s what he did write, in his third homily on the Acts of the Apostles: “I do not think there are many among bishops that will be saved, but many more that perish.”

Much more recently, the Servant of God Dorothy Day wrote in a letter:

I never expected much from the bishops. In all history, popes and bishops and father abbots seem to have been blind and power-loving and greedy. I never expected leadership from them. It is the saints that keep appearing all through history who keep things going.

The saints are not necessarily shepherds . . . but, in and through their love of God and neighbor, we do see the work of the Good Shepherd, caring for his flock. This is ultimately where the reading from Jeremiah points:

Behold, the days are coming, says the LORD,  
when I will raise up a righteous shoot to David;  
as king he shall reign and govern wisely,  
he shall do what is just and right in the land.

There are good priests and good bishops in the Church, and praise God if you have one or the other or both. But we are here for Jesus Christ — and, more importantly, Jesus is here for us, until the end of the age. Next Sunday Jesus will feed this shepherdless flock with the five loaves and two fishes, foreshadowing the Eucharistic feast that unites us today with all the faithful in every age and with the Blessed in heaven in the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. Dorothy Day said that too, in the same letter: “What I do expect is the bread of life. And down through the ages, there is that continuity.” That’s why we’re here. That’s why, even walking in dark valleys, we are never alone.

Registration for the 2024-2025 Religious Education year is now open for both children's catechism classes and Order of Christian Initiation for Adults/Teens sessions.

Online registration will be done through Flocknote, and a link to the form is available on our website (stmarykingman.com), under the Formation tab.

Paper registration forms are available at the Parish Office.

Paper forms and QR codes for online registration will also be available after all Masses on the weekend of June 29.

Paper forms, along with the necessary documents, should be completed and returned to the Parish Office **no later than August 1**.

All the necessary documents for online registrations must also be received **no later than August 1**.

**Registration for sacramental preparation will close on November 1st.** Children joining the St. Mary's Religious Education program after that date will begin their sacramental preparation the following year.

### **Documents that will be required at the time of registration**

Please review the list below carefully. *All documents must be the originals, which will be immediately scanned/copied and returned.*

- Child's birth certificate
- Child's Baptism certificate, if baptized
- Certificates for any other sacraments that the child has received in the Catholic Church.
- If your child has started their sacrament preparation at another parish, we will need a letter from that pastor to verify.

Baptized children **who have not attended any formal catechism classes in the last two years** will be placed in the Order of Christian Initiation Adapted for Children (OCIC) class.

### **Sponsor Requirements**

Participants who will be receiving their Baptism or Confirmation during this year will need a sponsor who meets the following requirements:

- The sponsor must be at least 16 years old, having received Baptism, Eucharist, **and Confirmation, and if applicable, married in the Catholic Church.**
- In order to function as a role model and support the candidate, the sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, who fully participates in the sacramental life of the Church in living a full and active Catholic life.
- The sponsor must be someone other than the mother or father of the candidate. Only one sponsor (godparent) is required, either male or female.
- This information must be verified by the sponsor's local pastor through a letter or email to the Religious Education Coordinator at St. Mary's.

**All sponsor information and documents must be received by October 30.**

## (PRACTICING) CATHOLIC

### A Deserted Place

In one of my favorite shows, “Parks and Recreation,” there is a scene where one of the characters, Jerry, is tasked with stuffing hundreds of envelopes with flyers as part of his volunteer work for a local city council campaign.

Jerry’s efficient, almost mechanical completion of the job amazes his coworkers, who gather to watch in awe while he folds, inserts, seals, and stamps — over and over again. After several hours, the huge pile of envelopes is finally ready for mailing ... and Jerry realizes that he has stuffed them all with the wrong piece of paper.

“I always say, it ain’t government work unless you do it twice,” he quips as he restarts the task.

In any work, no matter how worthy or fulfilling it is, there is a point where the task transforms into mere routine. It can happen with anything: ministry, marriage, parenthood, even prayer. There is no shame in this. It doesn’t mean that we don’t enjoy these pursuits or feel passion for the mission inherent in them.

It only means that we are human, and we get tired.

When the Apostles return from their travels, Jesus recognizes their exhaustion. He encourages them to “come away to a deserted place.” He inhabits a human body, so he knows the weariness to which it is subject. He knows what it is to be tired, to be hungry. He knows that it’s hard to do the work when your body is failing you.

It’s important for us to recognize those times when Jesus is calling us to a deserted place — and it’s important for us to follow him there, even if we are pursued by feelings of doubt and guilt, just as the Apostles were followed by crowds hungry for their ministry.

Solitude is not selfishness. Contemplation is not idleness. To withdraw does not mean to run away.

The work we do — whatever it is — deserves our whole strength. If we have lost that, there is only one place we are sure to find it again.

### Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

#### Question:

What can I do to help our family practice our faith each day?

#### Answer:

Some families practice their religion together as just another event on their schedule: go to church, observe Lent, help at the parish picnic, go to a meeting, volunteer time, make your confession, use your envelope... But the focus needs to be on who we are—God’s people, in relationship with him, loved, forgiven, and redeemed, and called to live and proclaim the Gospel. Our awareness of God’s presence and our sense of mission are supported by the daily rituals, celebrations, and traditions that help us stay focused. Sharing our faith strengthens us and clarifies the beliefs and values of Christian living.

Daily family practices include time for prayer—before meals, before bed, before important meetings and activities. Attend Sunday Mass together and discuss the homily afterward. Create family celebrations for holy days and holidays. Make religion a regular part of your discussions. Include others, especially the elderly and the less fortunate, in your activities and charitable efforts. By applying the virtues of faith, hope, and love to each day, faith becomes part of who your family is. It influences how you act towards others, what you value, and how mindful of God you are. Faith is the leaven of life that helps all of us rise to our calling and dignity as God’s people.

### REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO THE BAPTISM OF YOUR CHILD

In order to baptize your child in our parish, parent (s) please come to the Parish Office to obtain an outline, describing the necessary requirements — PRIOR to both the parents and godparents being scheduled to attend a required pre-baptism class:



#### Parents

1. Must be registered parishioner in our parish
2. Parent (s) must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation certificate.
3. If the parents are married, provide a copy of their Catholic marriage
4. Parent(s) must provide a copy of their child's birth certificate.

#### Godparent (s) At Least One:

1. Must be a practicing Catholic, following the teachings of the Catholic faith.
2. The godparent must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation (certificate is required).
3. The godparent, if married must provide a copy of their Catholic marriage certificate.

Only after receiving the required documentation, must the parent(s) and godparents (s) have attended the pre-baptism class, can the baptism of your child be scheduled.

We've recently finished our study program on the Book of Revelation. It was, to say the least, a very interesting and informative study—an eye-opener!
